11. <b>K:</b> Index and middle fingers extended and spread, thumb between them.
12. L: Thumb and index finger extended to form an "L" shape.

15. **0**: Fingers and thumb touch to form an "O" shape. 16. P: Similar to "K" but hand tilted downward. 17. Q: Similar to "G" but hand tilted downward. 18. R: Crossed index and middle fingers. 19. **S**: Fist with thumb crossing the front of the fingers. 20. T: Thumb between index and middle fingers in a fist. 21. U: Index and middle fingers extended together pointing up. 22. V: Index and middle fingers extended and spread apart. 23. W: Three fingers extended and spread apart. 24. X: Index finger bent, other fingers in fist. 25. Y: Thumb and pinky finger extended, other fingers folded. 26. Z: Index finger draws a "Z" in the air.

14. N: Thumb under two fingers, palm facing in.
