Arguments must be made to interpret findings, which suggests that conclusions are provisional and, to various degrees, sites of contestation. He launches into this gratifying book to show that beyond the problematic category of actual crime, the United States has seen the construction of a new spectacle of wasted youth that will have specific consequences for the daily lives of the next generation.
