Specifically, self-regulation skills are shown to produce greater results academically and are beneficial to overall life achievement. The intent of this study is to align with a high fidelity Montessori environment. This study measures some executive function skills such as: Self-regulation, planning, and persistence over a 6 week period following lessons in the Practical Life, Grace and Courtesy and Sensorial areas. We gathered data through pre and post intervention observations and a parent survey and questionnaire. We implemented interventions for the duration of a six week period. Observations occurred 5 days a week during a 3 hour work period in a Montessori Primary classroom located in rural Southwest Minnesota. The participant's ages ranged between 2-4 years and included four girls and one boy. The study demonstrated that a Montessori prepared environment offers multi pronged strategies to build executive function and pro-social behavior. Given the serious attention among the social science fields to equip young children with self-regulation skills, this study demonstrates the strength a Montessori education offers toward this end.
