IT INTEGRATES VISUAL, AUDITORY, AND KINESTHETIC LEARNING PATHWAYS TO ENHANCE MEMORY AND LEARNING OF WRITTEN LANGUAGE. THIS APPROACH EMPHASIZES THE TEACHING OF THE CONNECTIONS BETWEEN LETTERS AND SOUNDS, DECODING SKILLS, AND THE RULES GOVERNING LANGUAGE PATTERNS. ORTON-GILLINGHAM ACTIVITIES ARE PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS OF THIS METHODOLOGY, DESIGNED TO REINFORCE LEARNING THROUGH ENGAGING AND SYSTEMATIC EXERCISES.
