REASONS WHY TEACHERS FIB

MOTIVATING STUDENTS

For example, a teacher might exaggerate the ease of an upcoming test or the potential for improvement to encourage perseverance. These fibs are aimed at fostering a positive mindset and boosting student confidence.

MANAGING CLASSROOM BEHAVIOR

FABRICATIONS

More rarely, teachers may fabricate stories or scenarios, such as inventing consequences for misbehavior that are unlikely to occur, to deter negative actions and maintain discipline.
