IT INTEGRATES HISTORICAL DOCUMENTS, SURVIVOR STORIES, PHOTOGRAPHS, AND TIMELINE EVENTS TO PROVIDE A MULTIDIMENSIONAL UNDERSTANDING OF THE HOLOCAUST. THE WEBQUEST FORMAT ALLOWS LEARNERS TO WORK INDEPENDENTLY OR COLLABORATIVELY, FOSTERING ANALYTICAL SKILLS AND HISTORICAL EMPATHY.

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

THIS INITIAL PHASE PROVIDES ESSENTIAL BACKGROUND INFORMATION ON THE HOLOCAUST, INCLUDING DEFINITIONS, TIMELINES, AND KEY FIGURES. IT SETS THE STAGE FOR DEEPER INQUIRY BY ESTABLISHING A FACTUAL FOUNDATION.

RESEARCH AND EXPLORATION TASKS
