FORMAT AND DELIVERY

TECHNICAL AND PRODUCT KNOWLEDGE QUESTIONS

TYPING AND DATA ENTRY TESTS

MANY WORKING SOLUTIONS ROLES REQUIRE FAST AND ACCURATE TYPING SKILLS. ASSESSMENT QUESTIONS IN THIS CATEGORY INCLUDE TYPING PASSAGES WITHIN A TIME LIMIT TO MEASURE SPEED AND ACCURACY, WHICH ARE CRITICAL IN DATA ENTRY AND CHAT-BASED CUSTOMER SUPPORT POSITIONS.

PERSONALITY AND BEHAVIORAL QUESTIONS

THESE QUESTIONS AIM TO UNDERSTAND A CANDIDATE'S WORK STYLE, INTERPERSONAL SKILLS, AND HOW THEY MIGHT FIT WITHIN THE COMPANY CULTURE. THEY OFTEN INVOLVE SELECTING STATEMENTS THAT BEST DESCRIBE THE CANDIDATE OR RATING RESPONSES TO WORKPLACE SITUATIONS.

SAMPLE WORKING SOLUTIONS ASSESSMENT QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

SAMPLE SITUATIONAL JUDGMENT QUESTION

QUESTION: A CUSTOMER IS UPSET BECAUSE THEIR ORDER WAS DELAYED. THEY ARE RAISING THEIR VOICE AND DEMANDING A REFUND. WHAT IS THE BEST WAY TO HANDLE THIS SITUATION?

1. APOLOGIZE FOR THE INCONVENIENCE AND EXPLAIN THE DELAY.
2. IMMEDIATELY OFFER A FULL REFUND WITHOUT FURTHER DISCUSSION.
3. IGNORE THE CUSTOMER'S TONE AND CONTINUE WITH THE STANDARD SCRIPT.
4. TRANSFER THE CALL TO A SUPERVISOR RIGHT AWAY.

ANSWER: Option 1 is the best choice as it shows empathy and attempts to resolve the issue calmly without escalating the situation.

SAMPLE TYPING TEST QUESTION

TASK: Type the following sentence as accurately and quickly as possible: "Customer satisfaction is our top priority, and we strive to provide excellent service."

This test measures both speed and accuracy, which are crucial for roles involving chat support or data entry.

SAMPLE TECHNICAL QUESTION

QUESTION: If a customer reports that their internet connection keeps dropping, what is the first step you should take?

1. Advise the customer to restart their router.
2. Immediately schedule a technician visit.
3. Ask the customer to upgrade their service plan.
4. Suggest the customer switch to a different provider.

ANSWER: Option 1 is correct as restarting the router is a common initial troubleshooting step that can resolve connectivity issues.

EFFECTIVE STRATEGIES FOR PREPARING FOR ASSESSMENTS

The text is organized in two sections. Part One is focused on the theoretical foundations of narrative practice and on five basic principles. The five chapters of Part Two demonstrate the application of advanced narrative skills in practice with clients who are challenged by various life span transitions. Clients' narratives are included in each chapter to illustrate particular advanced narrative skills and major discussion points. The cultural context of such narratives may involve a combination of such factors as clients' race and ethnicity, language, religion and spirituality, gender, age, sexual orientation, disabling conditions, social class, and location. Tables and figures included in each chapter illustrate specifically how particular narrative strategies can be used with clients and also clarify how to use those approaches in combination with other practice frameworks, including family systems, task-centered, crisis, solution-focused, group mutual aid, cognitive behavioral, and brief theoretical approaches. In addition, to the individual, family, community, organizational, and cultural narratives, the book also includes other story forms such as poetry, metaphors, proverbs, parables, letters, personal journals, art, and music.

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
