Some exams may even consist of several components such as the Otis-Lennon School Ability Test (OLSAT), the Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test 2 (NNAT2), and the Cognitive Abilities Test (COGAT). Below outlines what each test covers. The OLSAT tests students' Verbal Comprehension and Reasoning Skills - such as their ability to follow Multi-step Oral Directions. It also tests students' abilities to Think Abstractly and Make Connections Using Verbal Cues. The NNAT2 tests students' nonverbal problem-solving skills such as: Abilities to perform Spatial Visualization, Serial Reasoning, Pattern Completion, and Reasoning by Analogy.
