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number. 1)In chapter 6, square is found using algebraic identity $(a+b)^2$ 2)In chapter 7, square is found using $a^2 = b^2 + (a+b)*(a-b)$ 3)In chapter 8, Vedic mathematics method is considered to calculate square of two digit no. 4)In chapter 9 and 10, the method given for two digit numbers is generalized to three and four digit numbers. 5)In chapter 13, square of a no. near to power of 10 or multiple of power of 10 or sub-multiple of power 10 is considered which is given in Vedic mathematics. 6)In chapter 14, the most general method, the 'Urdhva Tiryak' method is discussed which is given in Vedic mathematics. 7)In chapter 15, ratio method which is based on ratio of two successive digits is given. 8)In chapter 16, calculation using vinculum which is not a different method but often used when digits are big. 9)In chapter 17, square of two digit number is found using casting out 9's method which was used till now only for checking calculation. 10)In chapter 18, square of three digit number is found using casting out 9's and casting out 11's method which was used till now only for checking calculation. Hence this book can be considered as bible of calculation of squares as well as on properties of squares.

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
